Chlorine Bank: Eliminating Water Borne Illness and Creating Economic Opportunity in Rural Central America

The New Forests Project (NFP) is pleased to present the Chlorine Bank Report in Central America. Thanks to the support of our loyal supporters, the Chlorine Bank Program has greatly expanded the distribution of water and sanitation services and products, which also resulted in creating and expanding economic opportunities in rural communities in Honduras and El Salvador.

Expanding Services in Central America

In 2007 and 2008 the Chlorine Bank expanded its services to more than 200 communities. In 2007, a total of 28 NORWECO (series 2000 and 500) chlorinators were installed in various communities, benefiting more that 20,500 rural residents in Honduras (see attached list). So far in 2008, fifteen communities have had water devices installed, benefiting close to 6,745 people. Information on installations and number of beneficiaries for

El Salvador is still coming in for both 2007 and 2008.

Providing Needed Inputs for Water Systems

Early in 2007, the New Forests Project also invested US\$2,500 for the purchase and delivery of new NORWECO chlorinators to Honduras. In addition to this, several hundred packages of chlorine reactors were delivered to Honduras and El Salvador this year. These packages are used by local operators to regulate the concentration levels of chlorine in the water, ensuring that it is free of bacteria.

NFP was also instrumental in the acquisition of 25,600Lbs of chlorine tablets with a market value of US\$30,000. This generous donation from PPG is roughly equivalent to two years worth of supply for all of the chlorine banks in Honduras. The US \$5,300 delivery costs in refrigerated containers was entirely funded by the New Forests Project. The tablets arrived in Honduras in February 2008.

Strengthening Local Partners and Encouraging Long-term Sustainability

As part of strengthening the Chlorine Bank Program in Honduras and El Salvador, the New Forests Project invested \$4,000 worth of computer equipment and a delivery truck for the delivery of the water devices and chlorine products participating to communities. The NFP investment was matched by our Central American partners AHJASA and ASSA. To guarantee the financial sustainability of the program in the future, the New Forests Project is also working on developing a Chlorine Bank Business Plan for the next five years and will be providing training for staff. Training of the Chlorine Bank staff will be provided in November 2008 in coordination with the

Anthony Water and Sanitation District of New Mexico. Training will be provided both in the USA and in Honduras.

Supporting Partnerships Nationally and Internationally

In 2007, the New Forests Project was able to participate in and support the National Assembly for the Honduran Association of Water Boards. At this assembly, more than three hundred participants from Central America and the Caribbean were present to discuss the success and failures of their local Chlorine Bank and Circuit Rider programs.

The assembly was a great success, helping to raise AHJASA's (Honduras) and ASSA's (El Salvador) national and international profiles.

"I'm happy about the effectiveness of the chlorine. For me it is the best technology that the community could have chosen because with this equipment I don't have to monitor it as much and I like that because that way I have more time".

This year, the National Assembly was endorsed by the mayor of the town of Siguatepeque where the event took place. The participation of the New Forest Project was vital; not only did it support the huge organizational effort needed, it also created an opportunity for the NFP to collaborate with AHJASA staff members on a number of different issues. For example, in-depth meetings between the new CWI coordinator and AHJASA staff resulted in an increased understanding of the necessary components and improvements the Chlorine Bank Program needs to implement. The meetings also lead to the revival of a proposal to integrate a watershed protection component into the already existing Chlorine Bank and Circuit Rider programs.

Looking Forward

2007 has been a year of restructuring and refocusing for the New Forests Project and the Chlorine Bank. Thanks to the funds provided by donors like you, the New Forests Project has had the opportunity to reevaluate program activities and find new ways to strengthen existing projects and create the necessary infrastructure to support new projects.

In 2008, there was a concentrated effort to organize the information of one of the two Chlorine Bank programs. We created a database with demographic and geographic data on all communities benefiting from the program. This data base is also tracking existing services such as clinics, schools or community rooms that can serve as training facilities and information resources for the local community. The results thus far have allowed the NFP to track information for monitoring and reporting purposed and perform periodic evaluations. New Forests Project is also in the process of creating a maps and photographic archive.

The New Forest Project looks forward to increasing our reach in 2008, increasing our ability to track information in the 700 participant communities, and provide training for their local water associations.

Again, we are truly grateful for your support and look forward to collaborating together in 2009.
